



**FISCAL YEAR 2020-2021
RESULTS REPORT**



Community Partnerships, Inc. (CPI) had another successful year in 2020-2021. As the COVID-19 pandemic continued, our staff had to adapt and find new ways to provide meaningful, effective services to the people enrolled in our programs. Some staff did this by working remotely and some employees combined remote work with in-person services. They did a tremendous job, as you'll see in this Results Report!

As always, we depend on our volunteer Board of Directors, our community partners, and our supporters to help us achieve our mission—to *build inclusive communities that embrace the inherent potential of every individual*. CPI is committed to ensuring that the people we serve are active participants in their communities, living as independently as possible. To do this, we focus on helping people access existing, community resources and supports whenever possible. Last year, it was more important than ever that we provide assistance. People with disabilities have been disproportionately impacted by COVID-19.

We're proud of what the 1,090 people we supported last year achieved, and we're excited about what the new year will bring for the agency!



PROGRAM RESULTS

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT

The Supported Employment program for people with intellectual/developmental disabilities is one of Community Partnerships' cornerstone programs. In continuous operation in Wake County since 1984, the SE program provides evidence-based services and supports to help adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities find and maintain jobs in the community that pay competitive wages. Services are available to eligible consumers in Wake County.

RESULTS

—163 people received services.

—100% of consumers who found jobs last year reported that their jobs matched their career interests, wage goals, and work schedule needs, a sign that program staff is providing services that are authentically person-centered, based on individual needs and desires.

—Individuals enrolled in the program earned a combined income of approximately \$600,000.



PROGRAM RESULTS

INDIVIDUAL PLACEMENT & SUPPORT

The Individual Placement & Support program provides evidence-based services and supports to help adults with a history of mental illness and/or addiction find and maintain jobs in the community that pay competitive wages.

RESULTS

—77 people received services.

—The average hourly wage for individuals enrolled in the IPS program was \$10.56/hour. Minimum wage in North Carolina is \$7.25/hour.

—The program met or exceeded 7 out of 7 of its performance goals this fiscal year.

—95% of people who enrolled in the program found jobs within 20 weeks.



PROGRAM RESULTS

BRAIN INJURY SUPPORT SERVICES & TBI CASE MANGEMENT

The Brain Injury Support Services program provides individualized and group services to help people with brain injuries enter or return to employment. Staff from the BISS program provide several different, integrated service components to help consumers transition into the workforce. Services are provided in Wake, Pitt, Forsyth, and Mecklenburg Counties and their surrounding areas.

The TBI Case Management program provides case management services to adults with traumatic brain injuries. Participants access the program to get assistance with a large range of needs, including affordable housing, financial planning and budgeting, and to locate funds for assistance with basic needs.

RESULTS

- 128 people received services across both programs.
- 100% of satisfaction survey respondents reported that they were satisfied with the services they received.



PROGRAM RESULTS

COMMUNITY GUIDE & COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

The Community Guide program provides short-term, or intermittent services designed to help children and adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities access resources and services to help them live more independently in their communities.

The Community Connections program for people with intellectual/developmental disabilities provides interventions and supports to children and adults who:

- Are waiting for an I/DD eligibility determination
- Have received an I/DD diagnosis, but are on a waiting list for services

RESULTS

- 257 people received services across both programs.
- The Community Guide program has expanded into Durham, Johnston, and Cumberland Counties.
- 100% of participants who responded to our survey reported that they were satisfied with the services they received.



PROGRAM RESULTS

PARTNERS IN INCLUSION

CPI designed the Partners In Inclusion program to increase the availability and quality of community childcare and recreational settings for children and youth (ages 3-18) with disabilities or developmental concerns. PII also works to increase the participation of children and youth with disabilities in regular community settings with their typically-developing peers.

Staff provide different service components to achieve the program's goals, including: screening and evaluation, consultation and technical assistance, training and workshops, and referrals and linkage.


RESULTS

- 421 childcare and recreational providers received training.
- 101 childcare and recreational providers received technical assistance or consulting services.
